

## Dogs in Cars on Hot Days

Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts of travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.

- When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
- If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
- The vehicle should be a fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
- Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free-flowing air around the dog.
- When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
- Keep the dog in the shade – take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
- Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.
- Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure they needs of their dog(s) are met and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.

Right to Refuse Entries. Exhibitors/Competitors are reminded that show societies have the right under Kennel Club Regulation to refuse any entry.

## ***Rules and Regulations***

- 1) The Trials will be held under the Working Trials Rules and Regulations of the Kennel Club. Dogs entered at Kennel Club licensed Working Trials must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration.
- 2) Entries must be (a) on the official entry form, or a copy thereof, (b) received by the specified date and (c) accompanied by the correct fee and a stamped addressed envelope.
- 3) The committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
- 4) All dogs' resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the trial can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the competitor.
- 5) The order of running shall be determined by a draw and the competitors notified accordingly by post of their reporting time prior to the day of the Trial.
- 6) Dogs under eighteen calendar months of age on the closing date for the Trial are not eligible for entry.
- 7) Spayed bitches and castrated dogs may compete in the Trial.
- 8) Should circumstances so dictate the Society, in consultation with the Judges, may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them must be reported to the Kennel Club.
- 9) Judges at a Trial are prohibited from entering a dog which is recorded in their ownership or part ownership. Dogs will be disqualified if proved to have been handled by the scheduled judge's spouse or immediate family, or resident at the same address as the scheduled judge.
- 10) If entries in the Companion Dog (CD) stake exceed twenty, a second Judge may be appointed to judge the Group II exercises and the competitors notified accordingly.
- 11) No modifications will be made to this Schedule except by permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
- 12) Owners Liability. Owners must accept full liability for any injury to persons or property caused by their dogs and entries are accepted on the basis of owners indemnifying the Leamington Dog Training Club and its Officers against all claims in respect thereof.
- 13) Owners are requested to ensure that all dogs at the Trial are fully inoculated.
- 14) No bitch in season is allowed to compete.
- 15) In the event of insufficient entries being received the Committee reserve the right to cancel any one or more Stakes.
- 16) Not for Competition entries are not accepted.

## ***Classification and Definitions of Stakes***

1. When entering for Championship or Open Trials, wins at Members Working Trials will not count.
2. No dog entered in PD or TD stakes at a Championship Trial shall be eligible to enter in any other Stake at the meeting.
3. No Working Trial Stake shall be limited to less than Thirty. If a limit is imposed on entries in any Stake, it shall be carried out by ballot after the date of closing of entries. Championship TD or PD Stakes shall not be limited to numbers.

### ***COMPANION DOG STAKE (CD)***

For dogs which have not qualified W Dex.

### ***UTILITY DOG STAKE (UD)***

For dogs which have been awarded a Certificate of Merit in an open UD Stake. A dog is not eligible for entry in this Stake if it has qualified W Dex or is entered in the WD Stake at the same trial.

### ***WORKING DOG STAKE (WD)***

For dogs which have qualified C Dex & U Dex & have been awarded a Certificate of Merit in an Open WD Stake or qualified W Dex. A dog is not eligible for entry in this Stake if it has qualified T Dex or P Dex or entered in the TD or PD Stake at the same Trial.

### ***TRACKING DOG STAKE (TD)***

For dogs which have been awarded two Certificates of Merit in Open TD Stakes & have qualified W Dex at two Championship Trials.
