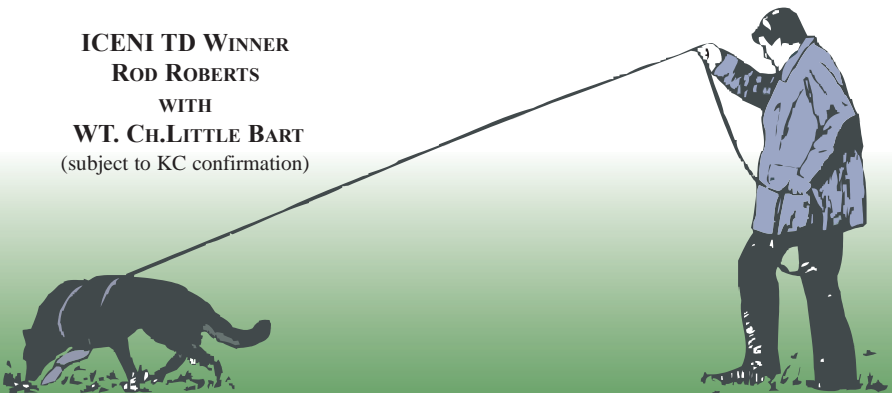

Dear Ed,

The following is an account of the 2005 National tracking competition in Germany Known as the Bundesfahrtprufung.as organised by the S.V I send it for consideration for inclusion in your magazine if you consider it suitable or interesting enough.

On the fourth of November this year Marilyn and myself set sail for the Hook

of Holland en route to Germany to Watch the national tracking championships of German shepherd dog club. (SV).

Briefly, for members new to the breed, there is one shepherd club in Germany, which is divided into designated areas, each area having any number of clubs. Various area competitions are held each year with areas sending in teams to national competitions.

Under present regulations any GSD entering any competition must have passed a BH Test, but that does not prevent a judge excluding a dog if he considers his temperament is unsound, indeed in schutzhund competitions the dog/bitch is assessed every time it competes.

The national tracking competition requires each competitor to complete two tracks ,the marks being added together to determine places. Each track is 1800 paces (not meters) and three hours old. It must include a semi circular leg and two acute angles.

The track consists of eight or nine legs, with a fresher cross track laid over two of the legs before the commencement of the track At this particular event the cross track was laid about half hour before the start.

To start the track the competitor is taken to a line between two markers about twenty-five meters apart, ten meters in front of this line is an article, which the dog must indicate. The handler shows the article to the judge, if it is the correct article the track commences at this point. The handler must now remain ten meters behind the dog .All dogs must wear a check chain in any competition and in this competition a tracking line may be attached to the chain, or a harness if worn .It is permissible to freetrack with the handler walking ten meters behind the dog, but most handlers seem to favour using a line This prevents any undue interference with the dog,

reinforced by the fact that the judge walks alongside the handler and sometimes even alongside the dog! The dog must stop on finding an article (most seem to lay down) and only then can the handler approach the dog to recover the article. He can then calmly praise the dog. On commanding the dog to track the handler must remain still until the dog has gone ten meters.

In total thirty dogs were entered and on the first day we were surprised to find that there were four different judges with four dogs starting at the same time, in the same area. It was difficult to know where to look first. Another surprise was the amount of land needed for each track(800X400m approx) On the Sunday a completely fresh tract of land was used for the second tracks. Interestingly each dog had a different but similar track pattern, which, for the benefit of spectators, was drawn on a newsagent's style billboard. near the start. Again interestingly none of the competitors bothered to look because I assume, they knew they could have no influence over the dog. Of the first four we selected a dog to watch and film. Obviously most spectators there knew who to watch, we had to take potluck.

The handler approached the judge and introduced himself. (This is always done as a matter of courtesy). He approached what I would call the start line, allowing the dog to go forward. After about ten meters the dog lay down. The handler went to the dog picked up an article and showed it the judge. He then calmly patted the dog, stood up straight and after two seconds commanded the dog to track who then set off at steady walking pace without lifting his head or altering his speed for about three hundred paces. He then lay down as he reached an article (as shown on the board) The handler showed the article to the judge, calmly praised the dog, waited a second or two and set off again. This dog along with many others, examined the cross

tracks, the acute and semi circular legs, but maintained its concentration and accuracy and completed the track the same steady fashion as it began. It scored ninety seven points out of a hundred, which indicates to me that it is acceptable for the dog to show a little initiative on corners and cross tracks. All the dogs and handlers we watched worked in the same calm, economical way. The average time taken to complete the track was about seventeen minutes and despite the length of the tracks and intensity of the dog's concentration I saw no signs of distress, indeed they looked as fresh as they did at the start. (One or two handlers didn't fare so well)

Overall we were impressed by the temperament, character and fitness of the dogs.and the calm efficient method of the handling. As you would expect the organisation was superb and we were made to feel most welcome. There were a few raised eyebrows when we told people here, where we were going and what to see and whilst there was little drama and excitement, it was nonetheless impressive and worth a return visit.

CAN YOU HELP?

Have you been asked that recently? What was your answer? Sometimes, when Trials managers ask, the reply is something like "Well, I'd like to, but..."; "I'm not confident enough to tracklay..."; "I can't leave my dogs..."; "I can't get time off work..."; or even, "Oh no, I want to work my dog...".

Working Trials is a great sport, but trials can only be run with the help of unpaid managers, tracklayers, search stewards, escorts, caterers, etc. Have you read the Judges' reports in this issue? Every judge has a list of thanks to helpers. All those helpers got time off work, left their dogs, laid tracks, and

some even gave up working their dogs so they could help.

BUT... the list isn't infinite. Tracklayers are getting older; they can't lay as many tracks as a few years ago. As a sport, we need more helpers, particularly tracklayers, preferably young ones. If you've never helped before, why not ring a Trials Manager, and offer? You don't have to leap in at the deep end, and go and lay Ticket tracks the first time you help! Escorting, laying searches, helping at base, making tea and sandwiches, being a general gofer, all give you a chance to watch dogs working, and to feel that you are giving something back to the sport that we all love. You never know - you might even enjoy it!

At the moment, a lot of societies are short of TD tracklayers. Have you noticed how it's nearly always the same band of people at almost every trial, particularly Championship trials? If you aren't confident about laying tracks, ask somebody to teach you, or go to one of the tracklayers training days advertised in WTM.

Some trials recently have been dropped from the calendar due to lack of help. Please don't let any more be lost - get out there and HELP!! Besides which, helping at trials is really satisfying. And after a day in the fields, in the wind and rain, with mud up to your armpits (Global warming? Not at Enfield in December!), you'll feel happy with a job well done - and the hot bath at the end of the day is absolutely wonderful, and even better for being so well deserved.
